Figurative Language is used by the Author to help create pictures in our brain and makes books more interesting. This also means they are hard to translate.

Simile Onomatopoeia Compares two things using Using English Words to the words like or as. create sounds. FXAMPI F FXAMPI F "He ran like the wind." "Ouch!" "Woof" "The dog was as tall as a "Bam" horse" Metaphor Compares two things WITHOUT using the words like or as. FXAMPI F Alliteration "All the world is a Stage" When the first sound in a "Why are you afraid? word is repeated. Are you a chicken!" Personification FXAMPI F Giving "Person" qualities or "The wind whistled on the windy actions to an object or day" animal. "Fred had a fabulous flipphone" FXAMPI F "The chair bumped into me" Hyperbole "The wind howled Making an exaggeration and through the trees" not to be taken literally EXAMPLE

"I'm so hungry I could eat a horse!" "That won't happen in a Million years"
